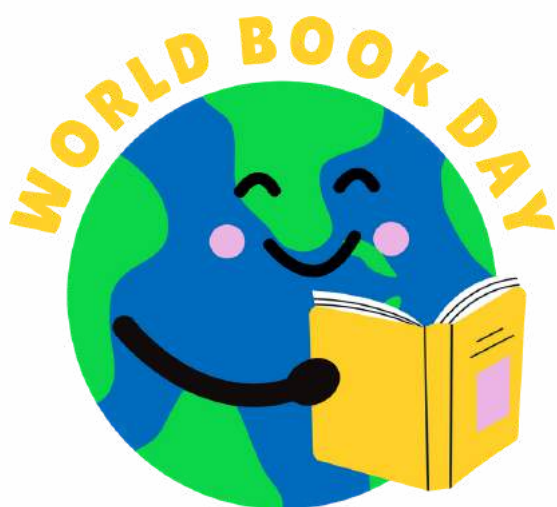

THE BIG LENT WALK

This Lent our schools is supporting CAFOD and joining other schools around the country to help fight poverty around the world.

To raise money, we're going to accept the challenge. CAFOD set the challenge to walk 200km.

Some of our school mission group went out and measured the distance of our walking route: 1.2km.

If we all do three laps, as a school family we will walk 6000km in solidarity with the poor, to try and bring change, put our faith into action and support the common good.

6000KM is 30 times what CAFOD are asking us to do. As a family, a team we can achieve so much more than we can alone.

6000KM is the same as running across 58,590 football fields, climbing the Shard 19,350 times or walking up and down the Channel Tunnel 120 times.

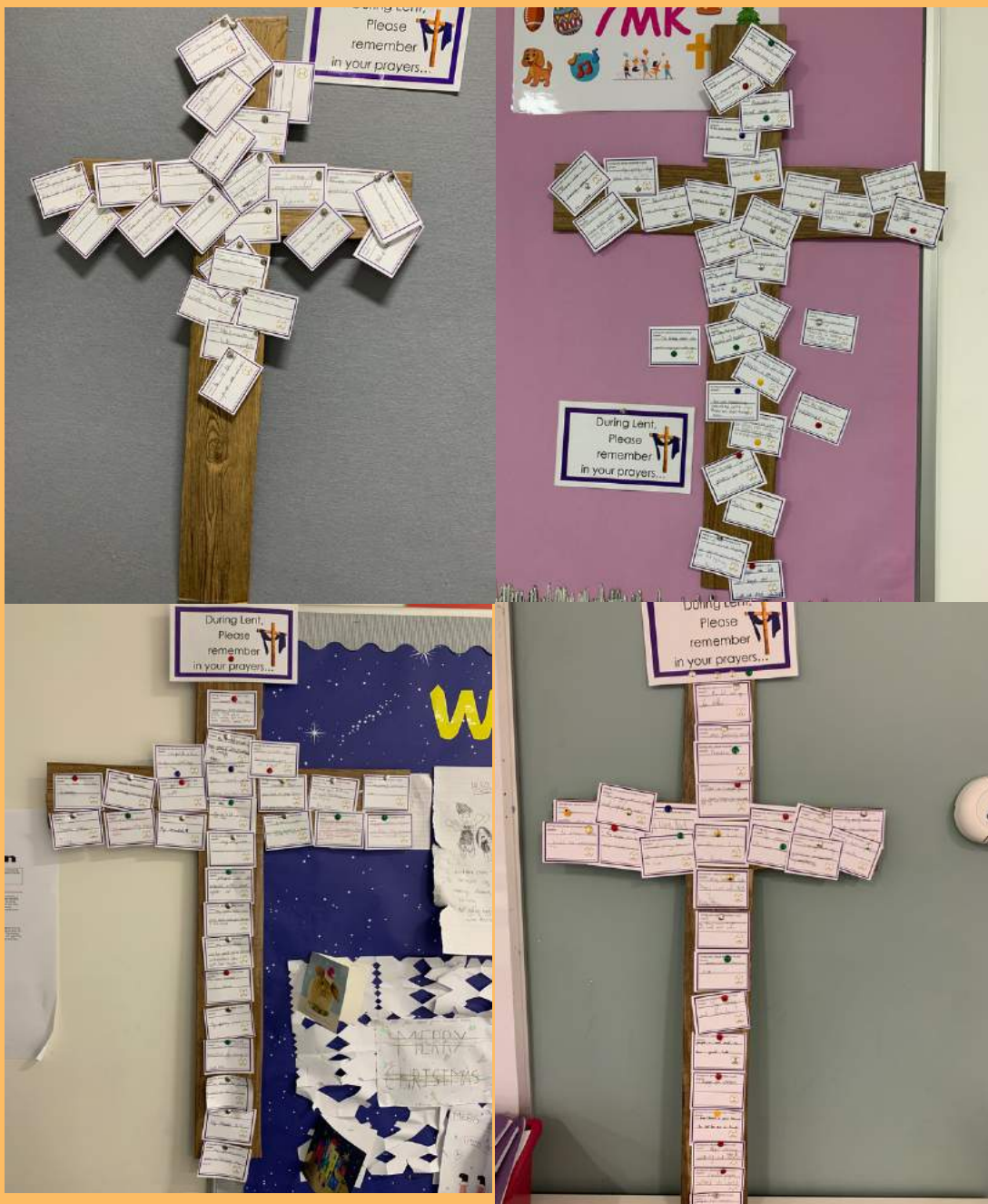

HIGH SCHOOL MUSICAL

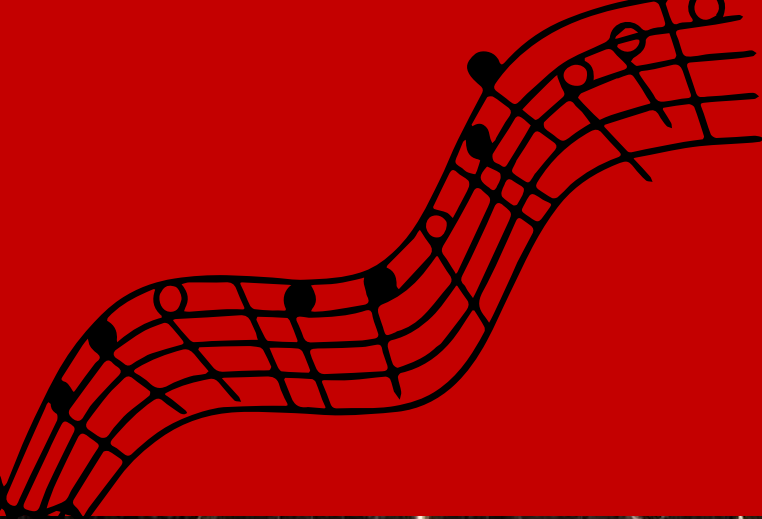


Our first production in over 5 years and WOW what a comeback.

LEARNING IN ACTION

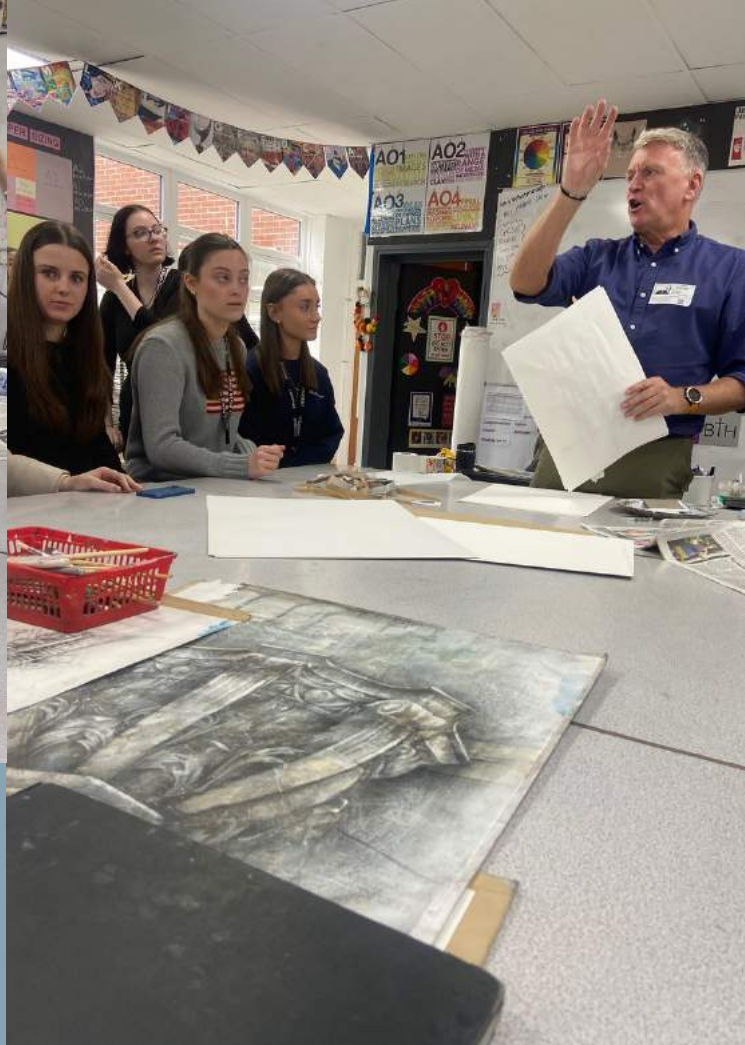
This week we have been going round and visiting lessons to see learning in action, celebrating everything that is fantastic in lessons around our school



CLASS OF 2023

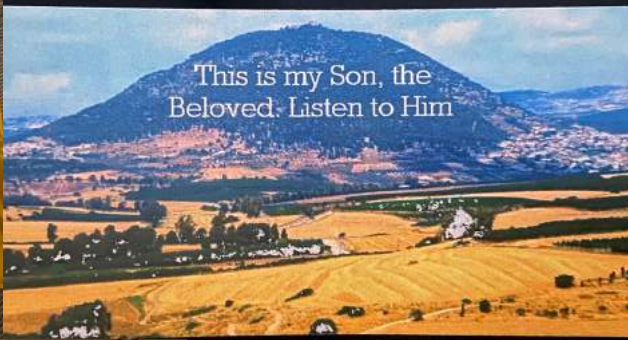
What a lovely evening for our 'Class of 2023' year 11's who were collecting their GCSE certificates! It was fantastic to catch up with them all and hear what they are up to!

In recent weeks we are receiving lots of reports from drivers and parents about the Oakfield road crossing when students are leaving school at 3pm. 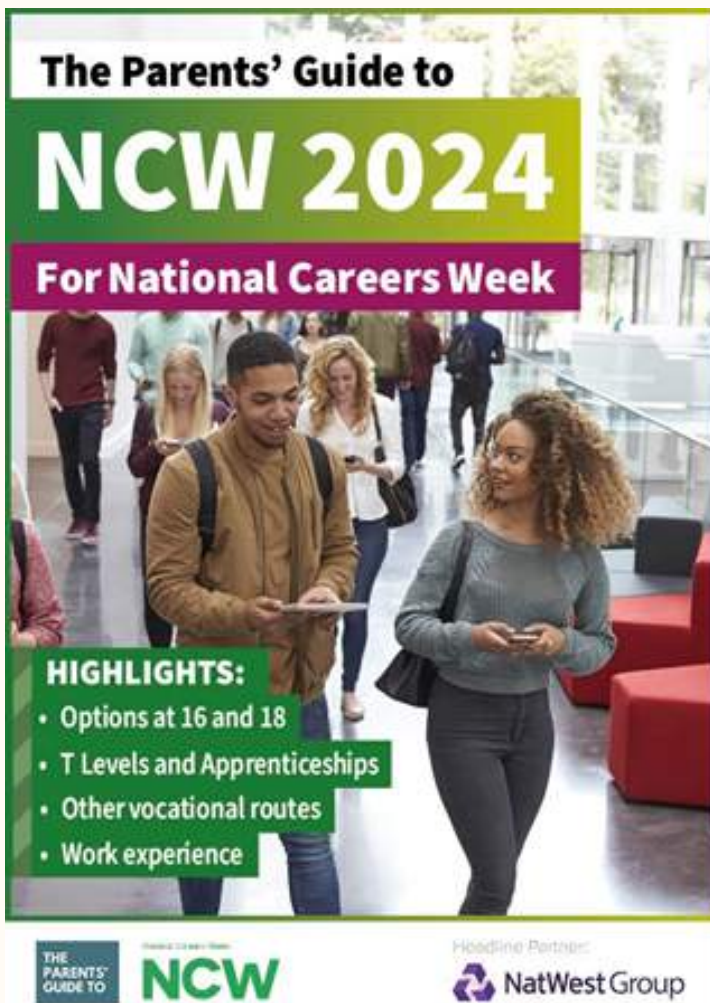
IMPORTANT
