These were for pupils who did not meet the government criteria and not allocated one of the 63 devices the school received from Department for Education. Also devices were bought for use in the classroom when a member of staff was self-isolating to allow live lessons to take place into classrooms. Supply staff could project teachers from home into classrooms on site. 30 hours Educational Psychologist time Stuart Crampton £2.940.00 As a result of the lockdowns a number of pupils have required extra therapeutic support and interventions to help them readjust to being back in school additional to the hours additionally budgeted for Graphic pads for Science team Shane Goldrick £270.00 The graphic pads were used to enhance the quality of teaching and learning during remote learning. The graphic pads enabled pupils to see staff provide live modelling of questions and produce demonstrations of graphs/charts in Science remote learning. This enabled pupils to engage more in Remote learning. This is also reflected in the remote learning feedback questionnaire. Staff are now using the pads during lessons within school to promote teaching and learning within the classroom showing the long term benefit of use. All staff are now trained on using these within the Science Department. Video Camera for PE moderations NEA and Microphone Shane Goldrick £700 The video camera enables GCSE/Cambridge and A level Physical Education pupils to be filmed for NEA examinations. It ensures that pupils can be filmed for NEA examinations with increasing numbers taking PE options each year. We now have a booking system in the PE department for staff to book out the camera so that pupils can be filmed for moderation and examination purposes. Pupils can also use the video camera for practical lessons for Assessment for Learning within their practical sports. Staff are now trained on how to use the camera and we can promote the Physical Education further with the use of this ICT.  Impact
 Pupils in Year 7/8/9 took part in physical activity during lockdown with former Hockey Olympian Michael Hoare who ran fitness sessions for our pupils over a half term during lockdown. We had hundreds of pupils taking part in remote learning physical activity over a half term period. As Michael runs a Hockey Lab business that specialises in this, he then gave staff CPD in this area. PE staff were then confident in delivery of remote learning physical activity and ran sessions remotely themselves for our pupils.
