Bursary Policy

Introduction

The 16-19 Bursary Fund was introduced by the Government as a replacement for the previous EMA scheme (Education Maintenance Allowance). From September 2011, the Bursary aims to support students within the Sixth Form to meet the needs of young people facing the greatest financial barriers to participation, targeting those most in need.

Aim for the Bursary

The aim of the Bursary is to remove barriers to learning; therefore, monies will be spent on items such as:

- Travel expenses, e.g., bus passes
- Internet connection at home, by providing an internet dongle
- Supplying study guides and books
- Providing financial support for any academic trips and activities

The money will be allocated as necessary and on items that are essential to that individual student, these will not necessarily be the same items or amount for all students.

Who is eligible to receive the Bursary?

 A young person from age 16 and under 19 on 31 August in the academic year in which they start their programme of study. They must have been living in the UK for at least 3 years (or provide written confirmation that they satisfy the government's residency criteria, if not already help by BTHCC) and must be able to provide sufficient evidence to support the application.

1. Nominated Bursary

This bursary is £1,200 a year and is paid weekly. It will be awarded to:

- Young people in care
- Care leavers
- Young people aged 16, 17 and 18 who are in receipt of income support (for example, young people who are living independently of their parents; those whose parents have died and teenage parents)
- Disabled young people in receipt of Employment Support Allowance who are also in receipt of Disability Living Allowance



2. Discretionary Bursary

This bursary is available to Blessed Thomas Holford Catholic College Sixth Form students not eligible for the Nominated Bursary who live in a household whose family income is £16,190 per annum or less and whose parents/carers are in receipt of any of the following:

- Income Support
- o Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- o Income related employment and support allowance
- o Part 6 of the immigration and asylum act
- Incapacity Allowance
- o Guaranteed pension credit (if student lives with a carer who is not of working age)
- Any young person could receive a bursary, as long as they attend provision that is:
 - Publicly funded; <u>and</u>
 - Subject to inspection by a public body that assures quality (e.g. Ofsted)

How will the Bursary be spent?

- The Head of Sixth Form along with the Business Manager will determine the students most in need of additional support based upon documentation provided
- There will be a review of the students' circumstances throughout each academic year to identify anyone who might become eligible during an academic year and a proportion of the fund will be set aside for this eventuality

Monitoring spending

- The Bursary spending will be monitored by the Business Manager and will be overseen by the Head of Sixth Form
- A record of all spending will be kept, providing evidence of how the money was spent and which students the money has supported

Bursary payments:

- Bursary money is linked to attendance, punctuality and conduct and payment will be stopped immediately if:
- a) a student's attendance reaches 80% or below and/or
- b) a student accrues 20 lates to Sixth Form in one academic year and/or
- c) a student accrues 20 Conduct Point including for late/poor quality work in one academic year
